Andrés Solimano, a Chilean –Italian national, holds a PhD in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). He is currently the chairman of the International Center for Globalization and Development, CIGLOB, based in Santiago, Chile. Formerly he was Regional Advisor at the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean and Director of the Project on International Mobility of Talent with United Nations University- World



Institute of Economic Research (UNU-WIDER) in Finland. He has worked as a consultant for the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, the International Labor Office and the Chilean Ministry of Labor and Pensions. Mr. Solimano was at the World Bank in Washington DC for 10 years where he held the position of Country Director; he also held positions of Economic Advisor and Senior Economist at the Macroeconomics and Growth Division, Economics Research Group. Mr. Solimano was also Executive Director for Chile and Ecuador at the Boards of the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) and the Inter-American Investment Corporation (IIC), and Representative of Chile at the Donors committee of the Multilateral Investment Fund (MIF) in Washington, D.C. Mr. Solimano was the Chairman of the Programming Committee of the Board of Executive Directors of the IDB.
